A. MiCareerQuest Middle Michigan Update

CEO Rishko informed the CEAC that Great Lakes Bay Michigan Works! is still planning on holding MICQMM. Unsure what the environment will look like, including the schools, the CEAC will be informed if any changes will be made. Co-Chairman Johnson asked CEO Rishko if this year's MICQMM will be similar to last year's event. CEO Rishko informed the CEAC that the target student number is 2,000 less than last year, which was 10,000. The quadrants will still be the same at HealthCare, Manufacturing, Construction, Agribusiness, with IT dispersed throughout.

B. Perkins Review Presentation

Doug Bush presented the Perking Presentation to the CEAC. Bush gave an overview of Perkins, which is now Perkins 5. There are key provisions that are emphasized in Perkins 5, which highlights workforce development. Switching from Perkins 4 to Perkins 5 means that there are different core performance indicators. Perkins funds must be used for activities that will be used towards target goals that lie within the core performance indicators. The Perkins Review Presentation was open for input from the CEAC
