A. Minutes from the April 25, 2022 CEAC Meeting

ITEM #7: ACTION/DISCUSSION/REPORTS

A. CEAC Co-Chair Election - Private Sector

CEO Rishko explained to the CEAC that there is a vacancy in the CEAC leadership role of Co-Chair due to the departure of Bob Peters. Erik Rodriguez from the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe has volunteered to serve as the Co-Chair of the CEAC.

Co-Chairman Bush called for any other nominations from the floor three times.

To elect Erik Rodriguez as the new Co-Chairman of the CEAC.

B. DOL Wagner-Peyser Rule Change Update

a. MW! System Impact

In 2020, the Department of Labor suggested a rule change that would take Wagner-Peyser staff and make them into Merritt staff. Because this was a nationwide change, there was pushback. There was overwhelming support, nationwide, to not implement this rule change. This could potentially be one of the largest impacts to the Michigan Works! system that has been seen in two decades. This wouldn't be a good change for the Michigan Works! system, but it looks like the end result is leaning the right way. CEO Rishko provided a flyer to the CEAC that shows the impact Wagner-Peyser staff had in the Michigan Works! system during the COVID-19 pandemic.

b. LEO Response

CEO Rishko provided the CEAC with LEO's response to the Wagner-Peyser change. The letter states that the change will take three years to implement, and confirms that the change will cost more than anticipated and that it will impact how effective the Michigan Works! system is.

C. GLBMW! Project Update/CEO Report

CEO Rishko presented the GLBMW! Project Update/CEO Report to the CEAC. Items included in this report are a Workforce update, including unemployment, wages and employment recovery, the WIOA Local Plan mid-term review, CMU MMU ARPA Grant Request update, Restaurant Ready Pilot-GPTF/ILC, MiCareerQuest Middle Michigan update, an update on the

GLBMW! Strategic Plan progress/process, and discussed childcare issues in the region. Rishko stated that he is going to discuss childcare at every CEAC meeting from now on.
